

Charles Richard Fisher

Charles R. Fisher was born July 18, 1959 to parents, Warren and Hattie Fisher of Allenwood, PA growing up with two brothers, Warren and Jack. Charlie and his wife, Julie, have two sons, Brian, a financial analysis specialist with Cigna Health Spring in Birmingham, AL and Brett, a junior at PSU majoring in information sciences and technology and a student manager for PSU football. The Fishers currently reside in Midlothian, VA where Charlie is the Associate Head Coach, Offensive Coordinator and Quarterbacks Coach for the University of Richmond Spiders football program.



At Warrior Run, Charlie was a solid academic student but his great loves were football and baseball. He was a four year determined player and quarterback on the football team. He also played baseball, was a member of the Varsity Club, the Weightlifting Club, was vice president of his class during his junior and senior years and was on the winter dance court.

After high school, Charlie attended Springfield College in Springfield, MA. In this academic and sports environment, Charlie played football as a wide receiver and quarterback and played baseball. He graduated in 1980 with a BS degree in physical education. He continued his education and love of football at Eastern Kentucky University as a graduate assistant for the D-1AA national championship team and was awarded his MA in sports management in 1984.

Secure in his desire to coach at the college level, Charlie's next stop was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Lenior-Rhyne University from 1985-1991 where he helped the team win the SAC championship in 1988. He has continued his excellence in coaching at stints at the following universities: head coach at the University of West Georgia, 1991-1998; offensive coordinator, quarterbacks and wide receiver coach at North Carolina State University, 1998-1999; Temple University, 2000-2002; Vanderbilt University, 2002-2010; Miami University of Ohio, 2011; Pennsylvania State University, 2012-2013; and University of Richmond, 2014-present. In all of these coaching experiences, Charlie was influential in helping players, especially quarterbacks and running backs, to attain their ultimate potential and in helping teams become conference champions. He has been instrumental in the development of eight All-Americans, five national award honorees, and 54 all-conference players. Included among these players are seven men who are or were NFL players, including quarterbacks; Jay Cutler, Zak Dysert, and Matt McGloin and running backs; Earl Bennett, Torry Holt, Koren Robinson and Nick Hartwell.



In addition, Charlie is a regular speaker at Nike and other coaching clinics, as well as high school football functions. He is a volunteer coach at the Fellowship of Christian Athletes sports camps. He has developed wide receiver drill DVDs and has an article published in the American Football Coaches Association Drill Manual. In 2013, he was inducted into the University of West Georgia Athletic Hall of Fame for his achievements as head coach. Locally, Charlie has hosted the Rick Foresman Charity Golf Tournament held at Wynding Brook Golf Course in July for the last three years. As a result of this fund raiser, youth sports in the Warrior Run area such as midget football, AYSO soccer, youth wrestling, and swimming have received over \$34,000.

Michael Litzelman

Michael Litzelman, a 1978 graduate of the Warrior Run School District, has been named to the Warrior Run Hall of Fame for 2015. As a stand-out wrestler in 1978, Litzelman was the PIAA State Champion in wrestling, making him the third champion in the school's history. He was also the 1978 Northeast Regional Runner Up, the District IV Champion, the Most Outstanding Wrestler and the East Sectional Champion.

In 1977 he was the PIAA State Runner up, the Northeast Regional Runner-Up, the District IV Runner Up and the East Sectional Runner Up. During 1977 Litzelman was a member of the Third Place Team. He was also the manager of the 1976 football team.

After high school Litzelman graduated from Columbus State University, GA, as a distinguished military graduate. Entering the army as an enlisted man, he worked his way up to Captain. Litzelman was in one of the early groups to be deployed to Afganistan. At one point he was side by side with Warrior Run Hall of Fame members Kirby Watson and Marvin Gordner.

In addition to Afganistan, he served overseas in Korea and Australia. His military awards include the Bronze Star, Meritorious Service Award, Army Commendation Award, Army Achievement Award, Global War on Terror Expeditionary Medal, Master Parachutist, Air Assault Badge, Airborne Rigger Award and German Jump Wings Award.

Litzelman also wrestled in the military and placed second and third in the Military Forces Wrestling Tournament. He retired as a Captain after twenty years of service.

Since returning to the area, he has been a volunteer Warrior Run elementary coach for



ten years. Litzelman and his wife Lynn, as members of the Warrior Run Mat Club, have raised over \$50,000 through raffles and food sales at tournaments and scrimmages. The money has been used to send kids to camp, to provide entry fees to tournaments, food for wrestlers, apparel and awards. This year some of the money raised went to the purchase of a new wrestling mat.

In addition, Litzelman is a PIAA wrestling official and has officiated at two Junior High State Tournaments and three Middle Atlantic Wrestling Association Eastern National Tournaments. He was inducted into the West Branch Valley Hall of Fame for wrestling and now serves on their Board of Directors. He was also inducted into the District IV Wrestling Coaches Hall of Fame.

Litzelman currently works for the Public Assistance Office in Williamsport. He and his wife Lynn live in Allenwood.

Carla Sue Overhiser Auten, a graduate of the Warrior Run School District, has been named to the Warrior Run Hall of Fame for 2015. While at Warrior Run, Auten was active in F.T.A., Jr. Historians, Dramatics Club, Pioneer School Newspaper and Pep Club. She also received awards for the Local Science Fair and Teenage Rodeo Safe Driving.

Auten graduated from Bloomsburg University in 1967 with a B.S. in Special Education. Continuing to further her education, she received a Master's in Education from Bloomsburg University in 1971.

Her career in education took her to classrooms both here in the United States and abroad. She taught for one year in Williamsport before heading to Karlsruhe and Heidelberg, Germany to teach. She joined her husband Harold, who served in the Army, stationed in Germany.

Upon returning to the states in 1970, Auten taught for Lycoming County at South Williamsport Area School District as a mixed category learning disabled/ EMR classroom teacher. Then as an IU 17 employee, she taught in the Muncy School District as a Special Education teacher until 1992. In 1992 Carla became a Muncy School District employee and remained with the district until her retirement in 2003. During that time she served as an inclusion/learning support/instructional support/literacy coach; these included many supportive roles that helped students make educational gains.

Auten taught at Susquehanna University in 2003 and remained an educational consultant throughout the area until 2013.

A Read to Succeed Grant was secured by Auten for the Muncy School District in 1999 and continued to bring educational dollars to the district for the next four years. The amount of the grant over that time frame exceeded \$400,000. Many disabled readers benefited from the funding she secured by having support in and out of the regular classroom.

Auten's list of accomplishments include being a finalist for PA Teacher of the Year (1998), inclusion in Who's Who Among America's Teachers (1996 & 2000) and the (1998) North Central Pennsylvania ASCD Curriculum and Supervision Award recipient.

Auten has presented educational workshops and information sessions for Professional Development in neighboring districts as well as at the national level. Her work in learning styles and maximizing instruction for teachers has been presented at the National Blue Ribbon Schools of Excellence Conference in Greenville-Spartanburg, SC, as well as the state conference for PAFPC at Seven Springs Resort, Champion, PA.

In addition to her work in the classroom, Auten is a community minded person. Cub Scout leader, Little League Team Mother, Muncy Borough Council Member and Muncy School Director are a few of the roles she has played in her community. She continues to be involved as a school director and serves as treasurer of the Muncy School Board (2011-present). Her work with retirees is vast. She is a member and officer of Lycoming County Chapter of PASR (PA Association of School Retirees) and President of the Huntersville/Pennsdale Senior Citizens group. Her work with the area volunteer fire companies resulted in consolidation of services between Muncy Borough and Muncy Creek Township Volunteer Fire Companies.

Married for forty-eight years, Carla and her husband Harold live in Pennsdale. They have two sons, Garth and Brian. Garth is a Physician's Assistant who works in Mechanicsburg, PA.
