Michael, a member of the class of 1964, was an active member of the school community. He was president of the student council, played varsity basketball and baseball. Mike also was a member of concert choir and participated in two musicals: Oklahoma and Bye Bye Birdie, where he played Conrad Birdie, the Elvis lookalike. Mike entered the United States Air Force Academy, in Colorado Springs, upon graduation from Warrior Run, graduating in 1968 with a BS in general engineering. Beginning active duty as a Second Lieutenant, he went directly into training as an intelligence officer followed by a tour in Vietnam. Mike served 22 years in the Air Force ending his career with the rank of Lieutenant

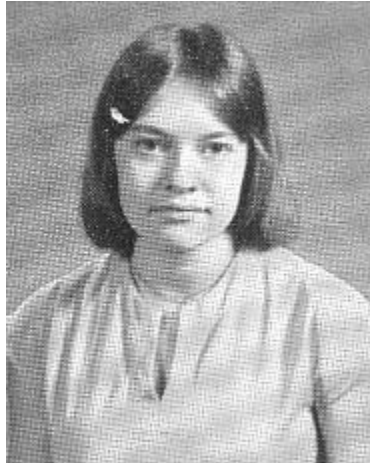
Colonel. During his time in the Air Force, Mike also earned an MS in Systems Management from the University of Southern California in 1978. Most of his military career was spent in the engineering field designing and developing space, missile, and communications systems for use by the military. Mike worked as an intelligence analyst at several assignments supporting US combat operations in Southeast Asia and the Middle East. He served as the Chief of the Advanced Systems and Planning Branch of the Defense Dissemination Program Office; Chief of the Systems and Mission Analysis Division of the National Reconnaissance Office; Director of the Systems Integration and Requirements Division of the USAF's Ballistic Missile Office; and Deputy Director of Research for Strategic Applications in the National Reconnaissance Office. His military honors include: Joint Meritorious Service Medal, 2 Oak Leaf Clusters; USAF Meritorious Service Medal, Oak Leaf Cluster; Joint Service Commendation Medal; Vietnam Campaign Ribbon; Air Force Commendation Medal, 4 Oak Leaf Clusters; and Honor Graduate, Defense Sensor Interpretation and Application Training Program.

After retiring from the Air Force, Michael continued his professional life as the program manager, technical lead, or project manager on a number of intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance programs for strategic ballistic missile programs ranging in size up to \$50 billion. He has led the engineering development of space, missile, communications, and information systems for the USAF and the US government as well as participating in and leading the development of strategic plans for a variety of government and industry initiatives, and implementing system integration plans for large space system development programs while managing diverse teams of engineers, scientists, and technicians. He currently works as the Strategic Programs Architect for the SAIC, Inc (Science Applications International Corporation, INC) in Seal Beach, CA.

Mike lives in Rancho Palos Verdes, CA with his wife, the former, Kathy Swartz, of Cicero, Illinois, whom he met while at the Air Force Academy when she was a student at Colorado State University. Kathy is the Deputy Director for Technology at Palos Verdes School District. They have been married for 40 years and have two terrific sons: Brian, a graduate of the United States Air Force Academy in 1995 and Brad, a graduate of Notre Dame in 1999. One is a doctor in Texas and the other is a business analyst for Mattel in California. Mike states in closing, "I am easily the luckiest man in the world and hope and pray I remain so. Whenever I can I visit the Vietnam Memorial near the Lincoln Memorial in DC; visiting my many classmates who gave what they had, I am proud to have known and been associated with all of them. It teaches me that I have much to give . . . including all that I have."

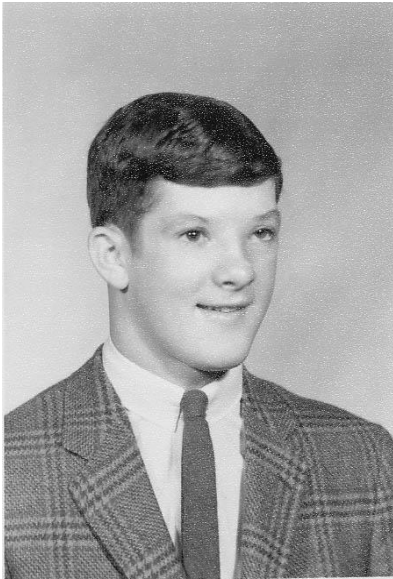

Living in Middletown, PA, she is married to Dennis Hursh. Yvonne and Dennis have five children; Rachel, John, Lydia, Joshua(deceased), and Benjamin ranging from 7 to 19 years old. Yvonne is serving the community in many ways; she was the treasurer of the Aldersgate United Methodist Church in Mechanicsburg. Mr. Lynn Watson, a 1970 graduate of Warrior Run High School, was commended in high school for his athletic abilities as well as his leadership skills. Tonight, Lynn is being recognized not only for his athletic contributions but also as one of our communities most recognized members for "giving back". Mr. Watson is proud of his community and shows his pride by what he does to give back to the children and family members that live here. As a high school student at Warrior Run, Lynn played football as well as wrestled. He was awarded the most outstanding football player and the most improved wrestler his junior year. His senior year he was awarded the football cooperation leadership award, most outstanding wrestler award and Lion's club student of the month. In 1970 Lynn placed 3rd in the National Junior Freestyle Championship for the United States Wrestling Federation and was awarded the Athletic Leadership Award.

After high school, Lynn attended Hargrave Military Academy. During his tenure at Hargrave, Lynn wrestled and played football. He was Virginia's Independent State Wrestling Champ in 1971 and voted Virginia Independent State Wrestling Association's Outstanding Wrestler plus received Hargrave Military Academy's MVP Wrestler award.
