Report on the progress made in attaining the goals of the wellness policy (REQUIRED):

The WRSD continues to meet the goals of the established district Wellness Policy. Areas of strength include an active district Wellness Team committed to offering wellness opportunities to both faculty, staff, students and our extended school community. Nutrition and physical education remain strong components of the comprehensive health education program. Family and consumer sciences classes continued to be offered at the middle and high school levels. Nutrition promotion is encouraged through the school's participation in the National School Lunch and Breakfast programs. The Smart Snacks in Schools guidelines are effectively implemented at all school levels. Faculty and staff model healthy nutrition and physical activity habits to students. The importance of physical and health education programs for students remain strongly supported by WRSD Adminstration.
